

The History of St. Coletta's of Illinois

Founded in 1949 by the Sisters of St. Francis of Assisi, St. Coletta's of Illinois began its mission from a modest farmhouse in Palos Park. The organization's purpose was to provide a Christian environment where children and adults with developmental disabilities could thrive. In its inaugural year, St. Coletta's served 29 boys, laying the foundation for a community centered on compassion, respect and individualized care.

As enrollment increased, St. Coletta's expanded its facilities to better serve its growing community. The campus soon included residential cottages, a school, a dining hall and a church. These additions allowed St. Coletta's to offer a comprehensive range of services designed to enhance the physical, mental, social, and spiritual well-being of its clients.

By 1990, efforts were underway to de-institutionalize the organization. Kennedy School was relocated to a vacant public school building in Palos Hills while residents were moved from dormitories on the Palos Park Campus to various group homes in the southwest suburbs.

The Vocational Training Program moved to a rented industrial facility in Bedford Park.

In 2001, St. Coletta's moved to its current location in Tinley Park, bringing its school and Vocational Training Program under one roof. The building was planned, designed and constructed for people with developmental disabilities in mind.





The organization continues to evolve and expand, providing new opportunities, programs and experiences to challenge participants to be as independent as possible.

In 2022, St. Coletta's transitioned all but one of its group homes to a fellow provider, allowing it to concentrate more fully on its core services: special education, vocational training, supported employment, and community support services.

In 2024, we introduced two additional services: Home-Based Services, pairing Self-Direction Assistants with families who choose to care for their loved ones at home rather than residential care facilities; and a Behavioral Health Clinic, providing specialized care and support to developmentally disabled individuals who also struggle with behavioral issues.

With your continued support, the future of St. Coletta's shines brightly, as we remain committed to empowering those we serve to reach their fullest potential.



Historical Timeline

1941

St. Coletta's, a school for boys with disabilities, is founded in Longmont, Colorado by the Sisters of St. Francis of Assisi

1949

Chicago Archbishop Samuel Cardinal Stritch commissions the Sisters of St. Francis of Assisi to open St. Coletta's of Chicago in Palos Park

1963

The Kennedy Training Center opens as a job training center for school graduates and provides vocational training to adults

1990

Residents move from dormitories on the Palos Park Campus to various group homes throughout the southwest suburbs

2017

Transition Town opens, providing job readiness and life skills to students ages 14-22

2022

St. Coletta's transfers its CILA license to Envision Unlimited

1948

A pivotal decision is made to relocate St. Coletta's from Colorado to Illinois, bringing it closer to the motherhouse in Milwaukee

1952

The Sisters rename their school the Lt. Joseph P. Kennedy, Jr. School for Exceptional Children after receiving a \$1.25 million grant from the Joseph P. Kennedy Foundation

1984

Girls are admitted for the first time, expanding St. Coletta's mission of service

2001

St. Coletta's moves to its current location in Tinley Park after building a facility tailored to individuals with developmental disabilities

2019

St. Coletta's launches its Autism Program, offering specialized care to address the growing needs of the community

2024

St. Coletta's expands its services by opening a Behavioral Health Clinic and introducing Self-Direction Assistant (SDA) services to support families of children and adults who choose to live at home



















































Humanitas Award

The Humanitas Award recognizes an individual at the national or local level who represents to the greatest extent possible, a role model for society both in a person's public and private life.






